Did you read the entire chapter?

1. What was Namaan’s biggest issue(s)? What are your biggest issues?

2. Who are the people who helped and encouraged Namaan? How was Namaan helped? What people helped you the most? How?

3. Why didn’t Namaan want to follow Elisha’s instructions? What godly counsel have you had a hard time accepting? What godly counsel do you have a hard time accepting?

4. What did it take for Namaan to acknowledge God? What did it take for you to acknowledge God?

5. How do you feel about the punishment Gehazi received? What helps you stay out of trouble?

6. What person do you identify with the most in this chapter? Why?

- What are the life application takeaways in this chapter?

1. How did Hoshea mess up? How does ignoring warnings put you at risk?

2. How did Israel mess up? What are the consequences of messing up?

3. What is idolatry? What helps you stay devoted and true to God?

4. What was the role of the prophets? Who serves as a prophet in your life?

5. How did the people of Israel change yet stay the same (v.32-34, 40-41)?

3. Why was Hezekiah significant? How does he succeed where others failed? How can you succeed?

4. How did Hezekiah do wrong? What did doing wrong cost Hezekiah? How can we avoid doing wrong?

5. How did the Assyrians view God (v.22, 32-35)? How do you accurately view God?

5. Why does Hezekiah show the envoys everything in his palace? On a scale from 1 to 10, how discreet are you? Why is confidentiality and discretion important (12-15)?

6. What do you find significant about Isaiah’s prophecy about Babylon? What determines what prophecies you believe (16-19)?

5. Who is Huldah? What’s your attitude concerning women in leadership and women serving in ordained Christian ministry (11-14)?

6. What engenders change and revival in Judah? What has engendered change and revival in your life (15-20)?
