4. **Read John 15:7.** As Christians, our daily devotional lives should include reading the Word of God. What is the principle and practice of reading the Word of God? Why is it important to read the Word of God?

5. **Read Matthew 7:7-11.** As Christians, our daily devotional lives should include prayer. What is the principle and practice of prayer? Why is it important to be in prayerful communication with Almighty God?
